"Imagination and Spirituality"

icking dry tea leaves is unsatisfying. To make an uplifting brew add hot water and time. Likewise, sacred words alone are dry ink on the page. A spiritual experience depends on imagination and timetested practices. Our tradition repeatedly invites us to make the past our own. We transform collective history into personal memory with playful creativity, grounded in study and our own life experience.

"In each generation, each person is to see him or herself as going forth from Egypt," our Haggadah directs. To do so takes preparation, beginning with reading the Torah, particularly the first fifteen chapters of Exodus. And yet, to internalize the story we need to draw on our own life experiences of constriction and liberation. The Seder is a model for all of Jewish life, involving family, good food, and linking ourselves meaningfully with values, collective belonging, and with our own story and inner life.

For years I have been working on a manuscript, currently entitled Moving Toward Wholeness: Pathways of ancient practice and personal imagination. The project emerged from a set of five classes taught at CBI on Jewish meditation. I was delighted by the strong response, drawing as many as seventy to an evening session. I taught it again and filmed the presentations, which included meditation, guided visualization, text study, and prayer. The manuscript, now getting reworked, is seven chapters long. I would like to email it to those in the congregation, who are willing to react. I will also present some of the experiential material at a series of CBI Coastal lunch and learns at a private home in Irvine from noon to 1:30 on April 17, 24, and May 1. Lunch is provided, which means that RSVPs are needed. Please consider exploring how ancient practices and personal imagination can enrich our lives. Looking BACK. Reaching FORWARD: 100 YEARS OF UNITED SYNAGOGUE and YOU!

n October of 2013 United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism will celebrate its 100 years of service to the Conservative Jewish Community. It was on Sunday February 23, 1913 at 531 West 123rd Street in New York, that Dr. Solomon Schechter raised a call for unity and foresaw a United Synagogue that would encompass the entire continent. Dr. Schechter considered The United Synagogue to be "the greatest bequest that I shall leave to American Israel."

For most Jews who identify with the Conservative movement, United Synagogue plays little if any role in their lives. Conservative Judaism, by contrast, is a dynamic approach to Jewish life that has impacted every aspect of America Jewry over the past century. The United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism is marking a historic milestone by looking ahead. This gathering will be about the future. In order for traditional egalitarian Judaism to flourish, arms of the movement will need to work strategically in partnership to assess how we might reach our enormous potential as both a spiritual and educational resource that serves to enhance our personal lives and our communal engagement.

The 100th anniversary conference will be a creative meeting of the minds, very different than when professionals and lay-leaders gath-

er for independent conventions held by Women's League, the Rabbinical Assembly, Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs, Executive Directors and the like. Those are important and help foster professional development from within. But one of Conservative Judaism's challenges over the years has been the general lack of rapport between these divisions over many decades. What happens in Baltimore from October 11-15 promises to be a new beginning that will frame our approach to the next hundred years.

I love Conservative Judaism. More than any other mode of Jewish expression, our Movement has the potential to generate the kind of Jewish life, dialogue and connections that our sages envisioned generations ago. While Conservative Judaism may be deeply informed by our shared history, its success and vitality are intertwined with our dreams and plans for the future. For OCCSP fans, please note that CBI member Arie Katz is this year's program chair, and he has invited the "best of Community Scholars" to participate in this convention. The learning and music will be unparalleled. The honest conversations unforgettable. The sharing of ideas unprecedented. Rabbi Spitz and I will be there. Now all we need is Board leaders, Sisterhood and Men's Club leaders, education VPs and educators, Rabbis, USY adult and student leaders, Executive Directors, Cantors, Pre-school directors, and, for those synagogues fortunate enough to have them, Caterers and Event Planners. It is my hope that CBI will be a leader in this regard. For information on registration, programming and ways that you can participate, please log on to www.usci100.org.
