#### "JUDAISM IN A WORLD OF DIFFERING FAITHS"

anukkah is coming and so is Christmas. The juxtaposition of the holidays is a reminder of commonality - winter holidays with lights and miracles- and divergence, vastly different stories and religious emphasis. The relationship between Christianity and Judaism has been very much on my mind lately due to my recent stay in a French monastery and our CBI winter scholars.

In November, I joined my friend Rabbi David Lazar of Stockholm, Sweden for five days in Burgundy at the Taize Monastery. Taize was founded by a Swiss Protestant, Brother Roger, after WWII to encourage Christian reconciliation. He brought Orthodox icons into the church and invited Catholic and Orthodox men to join with Protestants in dedicating themselves to simplicity, celibacy, and service. In the decades that followed. Taize became famous for the beauty of its chants, usually a single line from Psalms sung with a repetitive melody. Mass was a central part of each service and was offered to anyone who stepped forward, unlike the restriction of the Catholic Church on only offering Communion to fellow

Catholics. Over decades, the fame of Taize grew and now over a 100,000 youth make pilgrimage annually.

As I sat in the church on October 31st-All Saint's Day-over 3,000 young people harmonized while seated on the Church floor. In many European countries, sight-reading of music is taught in school and everyone held a hymnal with the words and musical notes. The singing, focused attention, and quiet at the center of the service moved me. The focal point of that evening was Mass and I watched closely the faces of those who took Communion and saw how many were deeply moved. During my stay I attended three such services each day and each was accompanied by Mass. As a Jew I became aware of how much death is at the center of Christianity, which struck me as a bit morose. I also appreciated that the Christian story is not mine. And yet, I also witnessed commonality.

One morning after services, which I attended with talit and tefillin, a man about my age approached me and said with a German accent, "Thank you for being here. Seeing you amongst us has opened my heart." The next morning, he and his wife were once again seated on the floor behind me. At the end of the service, the room mostly vacated, the man slowly raised his hands and with eyes closed, tears flowed down his face. His wife reached over and held his bare foot. No words were exchanged and he remained in the same position. I did not know if his emotion was guilt or joy, but what moved me deeply was their tender connection.

I have valued my Buddhist retreats and the opportunity of silence and meditation, which have stilled my interior and offered a taste of connection with a greater absolute. The Christian setting was more Jewish, using words to worship a Being beyond myself and doing so with forging community among worshippers. Interfaith experiences are complementary, evoking a deeper awareness of what is distinctive to Judaism and what we share as

spiritual seekers with others.

And now, for our winter presenters: Clive Lawton of England is a master teacher, scheduled for January 20-21, and on Friday night will address "The Jewish Trinity", seeking to clarify what distinguishes Judaism from Christianity. Our scholar on the Shabbat of February 24-25th is Professor Amy Jill Levine, who is an expert on reading the New Testament. The New York Times recently did an article (http:// www.nytimes.com/2011/11/26/us/ajewish-edition-of-the-new-testamentbeliefs.html) on her editing of a volume of Jewish commentators to the New Testament. Both of them are world-class teachers who will offer us insight into Judaism.

As we light Hanukkah candles we will celebrate the victory of the first revolt on behalf of religious freedom and the miracle of our survival as a vibrant, extended family of Jews. May we hear the echo of Isaiah's challenge for us to be "a light unto the nations" and may we honor the diversity of God's many children and our respective faiths. \$\Primath{\psi}\$

#### A PROMISE FOR FAMILIES IN ORANGE COUNTY

 (I was about six years ago when Scott and I looked at each other one day and realized how smoothly things had been going at home for several weeks running and we suddenly realized that it was because the children all seemed to be in a good place. It was a revelation: Things are better when the children are settled. Of course there are other dynamics that weigh on a family like fiscal challenges and professional insecurities. Imagine, though, what it would be like to negotiate one or more of these challenges AND have no safe place to call home: Nowhere to prepare healthy meals, nowhere to get a good night's sleep, nowhere to do homework or take care of personal hygiene. How much harder it is to look for a job, keep the children in school and maintain good health when you are transient.

The crisis of homelessness has many faces. The mission of FAMILY **PROMISE** is to provide compassion, care and hope for newly homeless families by allowing them to stav intact, enabling children to stay in their own schools and providing resources for parents to look for work and housing. Their 27-year record of successfully helping families across the U.S. avoid a cycle of poverty speaks for itself.

Congregation B'nai Israel is privileged to be among the first houses of worship to support Family Promise of Orange County. We will be partnering with Tustin Presbyterian in each thirteen-week rotation. Volunteers will be able to help in a variety of ways: Prepare meals, dine and socialize with guests, tutor and play with children and/or stay overnight. Our first week of duty will be February 12-19 and families are encouraged to help out as a unit. To enroll as a volunteer or for more information, please contact our terrific Family Promise Coordinator, Marla Nathan, at mnathan@gr8law. com or 714-651-9891. There is a recommended training session on January 3 from 6:00-9:00 PM at Tustin Presbyterian.

Sunday Supper at St. Paul's Episcopal Church is still going strong. I want to thank Judith Lipshutz and Joyce Walter for their dedication to this project, cultivating a broadbased group of capable, caring volunteers of all ages. CBI is enriched by every opportunity we pursue to engage with the wider community and other faith institutions.

I attended a SAC (Synagogue Action Committee) meeting for Jewish World Watch (JWW) in early December and it was breathtaking to see how their advocacy and actions on behalf of women in turbulent African countries has blossomed. This spring they will be adding two more walks to raise awareness about the crisis of genocide - one in the Bay area and another in Washington, DC. Several synagogues and day schools in Los Angeles are involved in creative fundraising for JWW. An 8th grade girl from the Pressman Academy particularly impressed me. Her bat mitzvah project, called "Jump for Darfur", involved students

and teachers seeking sponsorships from friends and neighbors to enter a Jump Rope contest that took place one afternoon during lunch. She raised over \$5000 in that effort. This year JWW is planning on bringing a fifty-person delegation to Washington DC for **Hear Her Voice**, a conference dealing with women's issues around the globe. Please see their website, www.iww.org, to learn how you can be part of this meaningful and vital venture and more about their inspiring work as an organization.

Our synagogue has many takeaways from our memorable weekend with Neshama Carlebach and friends, but, if I had to distill her core message. it is that the Jewish People as a light unto all nations have the capacity to shine even brighter when we unite with our brothers and sisters of other faiths to do God's holy work. "Rabbi Elazar said: Whoever does deeds of charity and justice is considered as having filled the work with lovingkindness." (Tractate Sukkah 49b).



#### **ELECTION SEASON...CBI STYLE**

ith all of the hoopla over the upcoming 2012 political campaign, you may have missed the fact that our shul recently had the real "first in the nation" election event. No, we didn't have a caucus, a Tea Party convention, an "Occupy CBI" or a televised candidate debate. But, on December 15th, we did hold our annual Congregational meeting, with B'nai Israel members acting on two items of importance to the synagogue—a new set of Bylaws, and our annual election of officers and directors.

Formany years, CBI's governance structure and activities have varied a bit (ok, maybe more than a bit) from what our Bylaws actually state. In addition, the Bylaws (drafted when Ronald Reagan was in office) have not kept pace with some technical legal changes. Earlier this year, Wendy Kottmeier chaired a special committee that included Neila Bernstein, Marissa Waldman, Uri Elzur and Mike Vishny, to prepare updated Bylaws reflecting our current practices and addressing legal changes in the past 20 years, but otherwise maintaining CBI's corporate structure and governance. We thank this committee for developing new Bylaws meeting these goals, which the Board of Directors adopted in October 2011, and our membership ratified at the Congregational meeting. While you won't notice any difference with our new Bylaws, we can all take comfort that CBI's

governance now is consistent with our basic organizational document, and "kosher" under current law.

At the Congregational meeting, we also elected a new Board of Directors, based on the slate of candidates developed through the hard work of our Nominating Committee led by Phyllis Abrams, with Scott Cross, Terry Ginsburg, Heather Katz and Annie Shugarman. Leaving the Board at the end of this year with our thanks and appreciation for their service are co-Vice Presidents Mike Mymon (Membership), Joyce Walter and Judith Lipschutz (Social Action), Marcy Shapiro (Youth), Dan Schwartz (Housing), Phyllis Abrams (Ritual), Heather Katz (Ways and Means), Michael Adler (CDC) (with Phyllis, Heather and Michael moving to the General Board), and General Board members Cathy Bardenstein, Uri Elzur and Eddie Kotkin.

Elected to take office for the 2012 term are co-Vice Presidents Eric Dangott (Ritual), Daryl Spector (Ways and Means), Wendy Kottmeier (CDC), Henry Klein (Housing), Andrea Alfi (Publicity), Marla Nathan and Michelle Madick (Social Action) and Terry Ginsburg (Youth) (with Marla and Terry moving from the General Board), and General Board members Wendy Arenson and Muriel Ullman. "Mitzvot are the Jewish arenas for knowing and experiencing God. Rather than relying on contemplation, Judaism has placed primary value on doing as the principal path for serving God...caring for individuals, feeding the hungry, freeing the captive, observing Shabbat, honoring our parents."

The teachers at the Child Development Center set up an environment where the children will have opportunities to perform *mitzvot*. Parents and teachers work hard to teach the principals of the Torah into tangible acts. We have discussed with the children about collecting toys for kids who might not have toys. The parents have arranged for the Tustin Fire Department to come visit with the children and collect toys they bought with their parents to donate to "Spark of Love". The children have brought stuffed animals to Friday Shabbat Experience and learned why it is a *mitzvah* to invite a quest to the Shabbat Table.

Another *mitzvah* the children do is to get an ice pack for their friends who are hurt. Every day the children take care of the earth by planting



# My CBI Story Ellen Mirowitz



We attended services at 'B' Street and recall attending High Holiday services in a variety of places during those early years - several local high schools, a Holiday Inn, an Elks Club lodge and Cavalry Church. We were also among the crowd of people who marched the Torahs from 'B' Street to the Bryan location.

When our children were in elementary school, I was co-editor of the Shofar. I often reminisce with my past co-editors about our early ventures into technology – our excitement using the modem to transmit *Yahrzeit* lists and then finally getting people to turn in articles on floppy disks so we could get the copy to Wolf Printing. We spent many a board meeting hand-stuffing and collating the Shofar and putting on mailing labels.

We have fond memories of both of our kids' b'nai mitzvot and other life cycle events. Lauren's bat mitzvah. *kiddush* and celebration all took place in the multi-purpose room that now serves as the social hall. When Eric's bar mitzvah rolled around three years later, the Sharon sanctuary had just been completed and his celebration was one of the first to be held in the newly remodeled social hall. We were also glad we could celebrate Lauren's recent marriage to Dave Zeitlin with an ufruf and horah on the bima at CBI, even though the ceremony itself took place in Philadelphia.

Over the past few years, Howard and I have been involved as lay






