LOOKING FORWARD

t CBI as we look toward the New Year, we harvest. The following is only a sampling from the many wonderful programs and services of our extended family:

Our teens this past month won the coveted prize of "Chapter of Excellence." To gain such recognition from among the 44 USY chapters in our region entailed submitting a sixinch binder of achievements which included doubling the membership, increasing charitable giving five-fold and posting a Facebook video entitled, "Hungry Hippos USY Style" that had over sixteen million views!

Our **CDC preschoolers** mark each Friday with a festive *Kabbalat Shabbat*service led by Linda Oxman. The Friday before the recent holiday of Shavuot, the children each brought in a package of noodles to honor the wheat harvest holiday. The noodles were donated to our monthly Social Action efforts of "Sunday Supper" to feed the hungry; we do this in partnership with St. Paul's Episcopal Church.

Our Religious School had nearly all the 7th grade graduates continue with Hebrew High, a voluntary Wednesday evening of dinner and two classes. Under the leadership of Rabbi Robin Hoffman, our students reach b'nai mitzvah celebrations with the skills of Hebrew reading and the context of Jewish knowledge. With Carl Cedar on guitar leading our youth in prayer each Sunday, I participate with goosebumps. Our collaborative team, including Liora Cohen and our davenners' clinic guides, meet each Shabbat morning, enabling our b'nai mitzvah to reach their goals with

precision, context, and joy.

Our Coastal Minyan this month at University Park drew over 60 participants on Shabbat morning. I acquired a bicycle so that I could pedal over to hear the chanting of Yehudah Solomon of the Moshav Band and found the communal prayer deeply moving.

For **Shabbatot** in Tustin. we have choices of study and prayer. including parashat haShavua (the weekly Torah study at 8:30AM) and after our weekly lunch, learning with Ahuva Ho, "Looking at *Tanakh* with Modern Lens." During the services there are also regular alternatives, including "Prayersong" chants with Amy Robinson Katz or meditation with me. Earlier this month, Amy led a Hal'lu service in our Family Life Center with musical accompaniment by many congregants. Dale Schatz also leads a musical service the final Shabbat morning of each month.

We are already preparing for our High Holyday services led by Hal Hurwitz. You may recall that Hal led services last *Rosh Hashanah*, day one. He will do so this year with the help of other congregants with the goal of familiar melodies combined with surprises to enable enhanced participation.

I pause to acknowledge the many contributions that Cantor Marcia Tilchin made over thirteen years to strengthen our community with her heartfelt chanting, interfaith leadership, social action, and warmth. I joined with scores of congregants at the American Jewish University and in the Sanctuary of CBI to celebrate Rabbi Tilchin's ordination. As she moves forward, she will surely use her talent and passion to contribute greatly to the Jewish people.

As we look forward as a CBI community, we do so with strength. In Hebrew the words, Rosh Hashanah mean both "Beginning of the Year" and "Beginning of Change." Each year offers the challenge to grow and create. We have a solid foundation as we continue to seek excellence in teaching, passion in prayer, communal care for each other, and uplift in our lives through our sacred legacy of Jewish wisdom and spirit. THE RABBI AS HAZZAN (VISIONARY)

n May 31, I enjoyed a beautiful tribute put together by my friends at CBI and my colleagues in the community. To be serenaded and entertained by rabbis, cantors and congregants who displayed their extraordinary talents and shared such beautiful words left me speechless. Thank you from the bottom of my heart to all who gave of themselves to create such a special afternoon: Mary Ann Malkoff, Beth Krom, Irma Minsky, Jonathan Fine, Tony Medeiros and the CBI office staff. I am touched by and grateful to everyone who made donations to charities in my honor, established my library fund. and bestowed upon me beautiful and thoughtful gifts. I leave you with some personal reflections on contemporary synagogue leadership that I shared at the event:

Every year during the last week of rabbinical school, there is a special ceremony held for Ziegler students in which soon-to-be ordinands receive the tallit that will later be draped upon them at ordination. Prior to the tallitot being handed out, graduates and faculty sit around a large square table and learn the 6th mishna of Pirkei Avot chapter 6, also known as the Baraita of Rabbi Meir, which begins with the words: "Gedolah Torah yoter min hakehunah u'min hamalkhut-Torah is greater than Priesthood and Royalty." Unlike the latter two, the acquisition of Torah requires no genetic component, but is attained through 50 "virtues" that are available to anyone who possesses the right combination of humility, generosity of spirit, capacity

A Special Feature: The Daniel **Zembrosky**

Youth in Art Fund



The Zembrosky Youth in Art Fund was established in 2010 by longstanding CBI members Alan and Bev Zembrosky in loving memory of their son, Daniel Zembrosky. Daniel was an established, talented artist who worked for American Greetings in the Animation Division. With American Greetings, he developed the storyline of Packages from Planet X, an animated cartoon show with a target audience of preteen boys ages 7 - 11, to the point of production. Disney picked up the development and aired the show.

At Danny's passing, American Greetings Properties requested changing the name of the main character to Dan Zembrosky, in honor of Danny and his very key creative contributions to this series. Because of Danny's love of art, Bev and Alan Zembrosky established the Art Fund so that the entire CBI community could benefit from Danny's enduring legacy. Some of the projects that the Zembrosky Youth in Art Fund has supported are the creation of personal siddur covers with colorful photos and embellishments for the 5th grade; the use of a resist technique by 2nd and 3rd graders in making challah covers; unique and thoughtful patterns applied to hand-made wooden Havdallah sets by 7 grade students. The Zembrosky Youth in Art Fund has also supported art projects for Machar and Kadima, sharing Danny's rich legacy of artistic expression with many



for hard work, love of study and love of people. Sample traits are *shmiat ha-ozen* – attentive listening, *b'vinat* halev - a perceptive heart, simha joy, and ahuv v'oheiv et HaMakom being beloved and loving God.

Were Rabbi Meir writing his baraita in a post-Holocaust, global Jewish world, he might also add hazon (vision) and ometz lev (courage) to his list of necessary virtues for those of us who have made a commitment to Jewish communal leadership in a modern context. Until the Enlightenment, the hundreds of thousands of Jewish prayer houses around the world were run not by rabbis, but by hazzanim, men with hazon – vision of an almost prophetic nature - who possessed a unique talent for lifting the congregation to new heights through prayer and ritual. It was, in fact, my passion for the traditional idiom of Jewish prayer and deep longing to communicate this to the people with whom I worshiped that compelled me to pursue an intense course of rabbinic scholarship more than twenty years ago. A true hazzan should be measured not by his or her voice or musicality, but by strength of vision for his or her community. When a rabbi taps into her inner hazzan her visionary self- she transcends the essential pastoral, administrative and teaching tasks associated with all cleray positions to imagine creative and holy outlets for Jewish seekers from every walk of life.

This need for vision is at least as important in Orange County as anywhere else. Early in my tenure at B'nai Israel, I came to understand that Orange County is home to more than its fair share of people camped at a distance from Mount Sinai, and that the most enduring way to bring them back is by the hand, one at a time. The focus of my work in the county to this point has been trying to discern what people are seeking, even when they don't know what to ask for, and to innovate programs and services that inspire them to move closer to the mountain.

Will these programs and services bring more Jews closer to Judaism? Today's Jewish leaders are asking

questions like, "If we build it, will they come?" and "Is the challenge of how to get Jews in the pews something that enough money can address?" Truthfully, the answer to these and all the questions that keep us up at night is, at best, "We don't know." But as Rabbi Tarfon cautioned us, "The day is long and the work load daunting... You are not obliged to finish the task, but neither are you free to neglect it" (Pirkei Avot 2:20-21). The dual mission of preserving the integrity of our traditions while reinterpreting them to keep them relevant is a tall order. Cultivating our vision, our hazon, and having the courage to implement it is the sacred obligation of every rabbi.

I had great hopes and dreams for how I would be able to serve Congregation B'nai Israel once I was done with rabbinical school. The congregation invested in me all these years so that I, in turn, could reinvest in you. In a bittersweet turn of events, this is no longer the path we will take forward. My heartfelt thanks goes out to the many of you who have reached out to share your concern for my family and me. Know that your calls, emails and letters escorted me to my long-awaited ordination with a sense of hope and purpose. You, my beloved congregants, are inscribed as seals upon my heart, and although I will not be with you in shul every week, I remain a source of support in times of joy and sorrow, a Jewish resource, and a caring friend.
