

Moses in a Political Season

oses is a featured guest $\bigcirc \mathcal{M}$ at our Passover seders, although the Haggadah only mentions him once and then in a Biblical quote. The rabbis composed the Haggadah with the focus on God, and yet, Moses is also present: the leader who helped liberate, educate, and guide the Israelites to the Promised Land. The rabbinic sages refer to Moses as Moshe Rabbenu- "Moses our teacher"- their highest accolade as fellow teachers. In this a political season in America, what can we learn from Moses about leadership? I share five lessons and links to Americana.

- 1. **Humility:** The Torah only uses one adjective to describe Moses: humble. The verse reads (Numbers 12:3): "Now Moses was a very humble man, more so than any other man on earth." Humility is not seeing oneself as inferior, rather it is appreciating the potential goodness in each person and accepting personal limitations with the desire to improve.
- Listening: After crossing the Reed Sea, Moses judges disputes. His father-in-law, Jethro, watches the inexperienced leader stand all day as the people wait in line. Jethro, seasoned as the priest of Midian,

cautions that continuing this pattern will lead to burn-out for the leader and the people. He advises Moses to delegate to a hierarchy of judges, while retaining the hardest cases. Moses listens, accepting counsel even from his father-in-law.

- 3. Integrity: In response to repeated challenges to Moses' authority, Moses says to God, I have been careful not to take any financial gain for myself (Numbers 16:15). Moses was reluctant to accept the reins of leadership, but once he did he gave his all to serve faithfully.
- 4. **Righteousness:** Moses conveys commandments that offer nourishment, dignity, and hope for all. Such laws include the Sabbath during which all have a right of rest; leaving the corners of the field and fallen gleanings for the poor; the cancellation of debts on the Sabbatical year; and the return of lands to the original tribal owners during the Jubilee year. And he teaches that a judge should not favor the poor. Each person is to be judged by his or her merits.
- 5. A Higher Perspective: The perspective that Moses offers throughout the Torah is of a God that is a caring Parent. Such a broad, compassionate view underlies the priorities that Moses conveys in guiding his former slave people to see themselves as "a nation of priests, a holy nation."

Moses as leader will continue to guide and uplift future generations. Two of America's most important icons-the Liberty Bell and the Statue of Liberty-will convey Moses' presence. The Pennsylvania State Assembly commissioned the Liberty Bell in 1751. It rang above the room where the Continental Congress passed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1775. The inscription on the bell read: "Proclaim Liberty thro' all the Land to all the Inhabitants Thereof"-Levit. XXVI 10.

When Frederic Bartholdi designed the Statue of Liberty in the 1870's, he

chose to place light around her head and a tablet in her hands, suggestive of Moses at Mount Sinai.

These two icons inform the final shot of the 1956 blockbuster, *The Ten Commandments*: Charlton Heston adopts the pose of the Statue of Liberty and quotes the Biblical inscription found on the Liberty Bell. Moses is at the center of Jewish and American identity.

We are in a political season. Our prospective leaders espouse their respect for Biblical faith. May they emulate the virtues of Moses' leadership. ❖
