RABBI SPITZ'S MESSAGE



"A Simple and Complex Love Story"

Psalms are a new-found romance. I love their straight-forward honesty, encompassing joy and pain, hope and despair, intimacy with and distance from the Creator, particularism, and universalism. I am drawn to the tension of opposites, as if a musical string pulled in two directions. For in that tension is life's harmonic sound. Collectively, the 150 psalms are a magnificent symphony. expressing the range of human yearnings and the Jewish people's core identities. These hymns buoyed Jews across place and time with memories of King David's life, return from exiles past, and a vision of a brighter horizon ahead. Psalms served as components of daily prayer and were

chanted when a special need arose. We do not know when any individual Psalm was composed, but collectively they were completed over 2500 years ago.

In March 2020 as we were going into quarantine, I began a new project. My goal was to teach each Psalm sequentially for a half-hour. I did not know how far I would get. Those who joined me on screen put wind in my sails with comments that often illuminated and whose presence motivated me to prepare patiently and deeply. I began with translation, choosing to keep God gender-neutral and to hone closely to the Hebrew in order to convey specificity of words and intentional ambiguity. I read a broad range of commentors, including Jewish sages of exile and contemporary literary scholars, and sought to discern how lines of Psalms had rippled forward across Jewish, Christian, and Western culture. I had known many lines from Psalms by heart, especially those sung as part of liturgy. But this was the first time that I examined each Psalm as a separate artwork, with the ultimate question being how were these words still relevant.

I could not have done this project without Zoom, enabling me to come into the homes of my fellow-learners. And what we studied, got recorded. Many hundreds have participated, some from across the

globe. For most of this process I selected a participant to honor for each class. Doing so offered the gratification of gift-giving and the opportunity to showcase the remarkability and diversity of participants.

During my years as the rabbi of CBI, I have loved to teach and have always sought to do so with new material to enable my own growth and that of my students. Although COVID kept us physically a part, it also allowed us to learn together. As I write, we are within weeks of reaching Psalm 150. I delight as if reaching a mountain top after a formidable climb. Each of the Psalms had its own challenges and joys, both luring forward and giving pause. Please consider choosing a Psalm from the portfolio on our website. In doing so, you will take greater possession of a treasure that is already yours.

I close with deep gratitude:

for Psalms, meant to be read and reread and sung;

for each of you who have joined me for a class or will choose to yet tap into these teachings:

for being a Jew who as part of a continuity is both heir and creator. ❖

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

PHYLLIS ABRAMS



As a person with an extensive educational experience focused in mathematics, I have had a lot of practice working with algebraic formulas. One of the most basic ones (but still fascinating) is: 'distance = time (rate) multiplied by speed' or (D = T x S). What prompted me to think of this instead of the High Holiday greeting that I had initially planned was

because I was thinking of the current status of things at CBI, and the not-too-distant future, when things might resemble what they once were. How long would it take us to get there?

Our community has come a long way because in sharp contrast to just a few months ago. Last Shabbat, my husband and I sat in our usual seats, davening together. It was remarkable just to look around and see everyone; with almost everything in its right place and time. When you work with the formula of $D=T\times S$, it is a fairly simple task to solve for any single missing variable if you are given specific values for at least two of the other variables. However, because of the complexities that exist in the world right now, we do not know any of the specific values for the remaining variables in our formula. Instead we have adjectives such as slow and deliberate for time, and cautious but determined for speed.

We are hoping that the **distance** we need to travel is the same as the time between now and Rosh Hashanah. The **speed** is our precautionary note because we don't want to go too fast and overlook a necessary step or go too slow and miss our goal of being together, as a community, by Rosh Hashanah.

In 1987 the Dow Jones Industrial stock average closed the year at 1,938, a gallon of gas cost 89 cents, "The Simpsons" premiered on television, and Rabbi Elie Spitz became the rabbi at Congregation B'nai Israel. Consequently, the High Holidays of 2021 will be bitter sweet for CBI because it will mark the last High Holiday service conducted by Rabbi Elie Spitz. One of my fondest memories is when I wandered into the B Street warehouse complete with its blue walls and decorative poles, and hearing Rabbi Spitz start the service as he walked up the center aisle, singing the morning prayers. That was the moment I knew I had found a home. While our surroundings may have changed, Rabbi Spitz's spiritual leadership has not.

Change, it seems, has been the touchstone in our lives for the past 16 months since Covid-19 invaded the world. The experiences of the very recent past have left us a bit isolated and fearful and sadly have given us a vision of the future that is somewhat opaque. However, recent events would strongly suggest that we are coming out from beneath the dark clouds and headed for a much brighter tomorrow and our synagogue will once again be the keystone in our lives of faith and friendship.

We hope you have a happy, healthy, and wonderful summer, and from our home to yours, from Steven and me to all of you, we wish you an early L'Shana Tovah.


